**CTHA Frequent Trail Rider Program**

In keeping with the love we share for our horses and the great number of hours we spend on their backs, CTHA wishes to recognize those members who ride our beautiful trails and log the long hours to prove it.

Incentives will be awarded for 100 hours, 250 hours, 500 hours, 750 hours & 1000 hours of trail riding as outlined in the CTHA Frequent Rider Program. These incentives will consist of patches for each of the five levels of achievement. The patches will compliment each other and will be suitable for sewing on a favorite riding jacket, denim jacket or perhaps onto a corner of your saddle pad. To be eligible to participate in this program, you must work on a public land manager organized \* trail work project on public land at least 6 hours for every 100 hours of trail riding logged.

(\*This would be CTHA, Forest Service, Ga. DNR, etc)

Once you have logged your first 100 hours of trail riding, mail your log sheet back to CTHA, PO Box 211, Dahlonega, GA 30533. CTHA automatically keeps a record of your hours spent on CTHA trail work projects. If you work on a public land manager organized trail project outside of a CTHA scheduled workday, you will need to provide details of your project (when, where, duration, what was done). We will record your accomplishment and send you the first of five patches you may earn in the Frequent Rider Program. Just repeat the process as you reach each additional level of achievement. Send in your trail riding log at any time, not just when you've reached a milestone.

We want this program to be your program. Have fun and enjoy yourself. Set your own pace. Set your own goals. When you earn your patches you know you have accomplished your goals but also you have helped tell our federal and state authorities that we need every mile of trail system we have and that we are working together to construct and maintain our equestrian and multi-use trails.

\*Hours are cumulative year to year. (It may take some riders 2 or more years to reach the 100-hour level.) Only hours in the saddle on a trail ride count. Time spent traveling to and from a ride and non-trail riding time is ineligible toward award levels.
